(i)	The particulars of its organization, functions and duties;	<p>High Commission of India is headed by High Commissioner and has following 07 Wings: (i) Political Wing (ii) Administration Wing (iii) Press, Information and Culture Wing (iv) Military Wing (v) Commerce Wing (vi) Consular Wing (vii) Education wing.</p> <p>Each Wing is headed by a First Secretary/Second Secretary rank officer.</p> <p>The functions of the High Commission inter alia, include political and economic cooperation, trade and investment promotion, cultural interaction, press and media liaison in bilateral and multilateral contexts. Mission functions within the purview of business allocated to the Ministry of External Affairs under the Government of India's Allocation of Business Rules and Transaction of Business Rules.</p>
(ii)	The powers and duties of its officers and employees;	<p>General Administrative powers are derived from IFS (PLCA) Rules, as amended from time to time.</p> <p>Financial powers of the Officers of the High Commission of India have been detailed in the Delegated Financial powers of the Government of India's Representatives Abroad.</p> <p>Other powers are derived from the Passport Act of India. The Officers of the Mission function under the guidance and supervision of the High Commissioner.</p>
